









Origins of civilization











































Kinds of evidence

• Eyewitness testimony from the place and time being studied


Secondary source


• A scholar collects and interprets primary sources on a subject

• Tertiary source

- Ceneral scholarly consensus on a subject
 Includes encyclopedias, textbooks, and almost everything on the web
 NOT ALLOWED as a source for history papers
