- Escalation of Athenian influence




Natural philosophy

- Anaxagoras

 - Attempted to give a scientific account of eclipses, meteors, rainbows, and the sun
 Famous for introducing the cosmological concept of Nous (mind), as an ordering force
- Empedocles
 - Originator of the cosmogenic theory of the four classical elements (earth, water, air, fire)
- Leucippus and Democritus
 - Everything is composed entirely of various imperishable, indivisible elements called atoms
- Hippocrates

 - Father of Western medicine
 Use of prognosis and clinical observation, the systematic categorization of diseases, or the formulation of humoral theory




Pythagoras

- From Samos, sixth century

- Mathematical and scientific discoveries
 Music and harmony
 The rationality of aesthetics
- Founder of Pythagoreanism
 - Transmigration of souls
 Communal life
- Saw himself as a lover of wisdom ("philosopher")




Socrates

- Process was to ask a series of questions that exposed irrational and superstitious thought
- Never wrote anything
 Change created through dialog
 Known through the writings of Plato
- Traditionalists saw him as a
- threat to order

 Subject of Aristophanes's Clouds

 Executed in 399 for irreligion and corruption of the youth
- Then and now considered the founder of modern philosophy



- Republic




Aristotle

- "Third generation" of Socratic philosophy
- Practical application of philosophy
 Surveyed existing knowledge in many fields—politics, theater, poetry
 Examined what worked and what did not
 Derived basic principles
- Tutor of Alexander the Great





The Undeclared War – Causes • Naming of the war - Conflict between Delian League and Peloponnesian League - Undeclared — sporadic battles • Trade rivalry - Two maritime commercial powers — Athens and Corinth • Megara - Switches sides out of fear of Corinth - Hands Athenians an important port • Helot rebellion - Earthquake leads to uprising - Helots relocated to Naupactos • Corinth goes to war with Athens • Athens builds the Long Walls





The Thirty Years' Peace

- Neither side interferes with allies of the other
- Neutrals free to join either side

- Sparta and Athens can use force within their alliances






